November 21, 2021

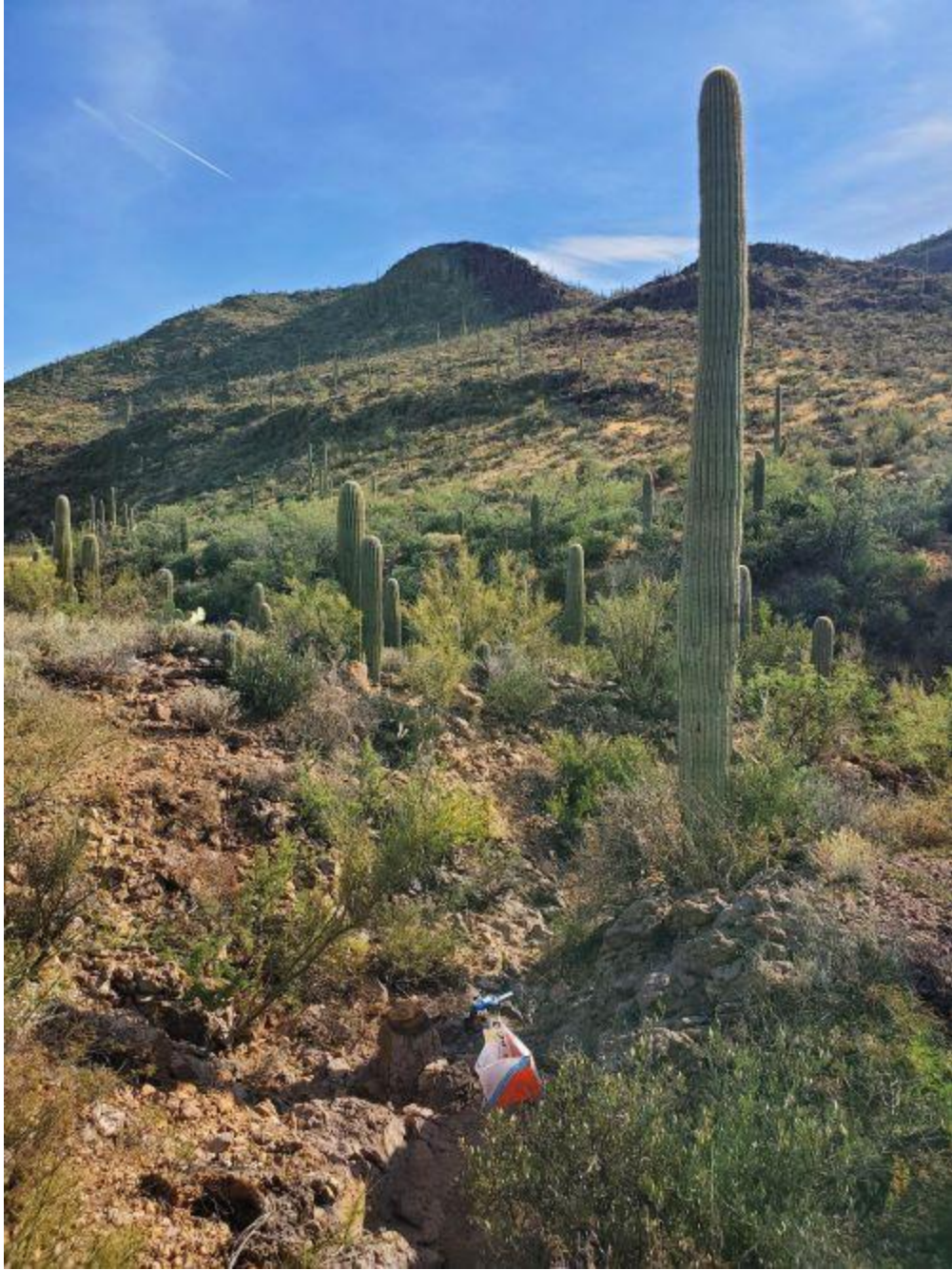

This spring, the club acquired a set of electronic punching equipment and we've been rolling out its usage at non-street-O events. Many runners wear some kind of gps device while out on the course, recording their progress for later analysis. If you've done that then you can upload your route to [Livelox](#) to see exactly where you've been. If you don't have a gps track, you can still use Livelox to see what others have done and get some inspiration for your next outing!
